Prospectus for the 2019 Berkshire County Championships and Open Tournament
 Sunday July 21st. Archery GB, UK Record Status Tournament.
 Lady Paramount: Mrs Jane Burnham.

Venue.	The Berkshire County Sports Club (BCSC), Sonning Lane, Sonning, Reading, West Berkshire, RG4 6ST.	
Closing date.	Saturday 13 th July 2019 for Target List. No substitutions will be accepted.	
Judges.	Andy Turner (CoJ), Ted Burnham (DOS), Georgina Cutts, Guy Perring and Graham Pink.	
Rounds.	WA70 Senior (Recurve, BB, Longbow); WA60 Master ¹ and Cadet ² , (Recurve, BB, Longbow); & WA50 (Compound & W1). Junior rounds; Metric 122-50m, Metric 122-40m, Metric 122-30m (Recurve, BB, Longbow). Single rounds are available both AM and PM. The championships rounds for Berkshire Archers will be a AGB Record Status Double WA70 (recurve, barebow, Longbow), Double WA50 (Compounds) and WA60 for juniors.	
Participation.	We welcome all archers including novice ³ archers and encouraged them to enter. Archers can participate in any of the rounds; they can shoot 30m, 40m or 50m rounds or can shoot at the longer distance of 60m or 70m. They can also shoot two single rounds with each being a different distance.	
Team rounds.	Clubs representatives may register their club for the afternoon team round over the lunch period at the registration tent. Teams are made up of three archers from the same club. Each team will comprise of one archer shooting a WA70 or WA60 round (Recurve bow); one shooting a WA50 round (Compound bow) and one Junior Archer shooting any Junior Metric round (Recurve bow). One team member must be female. After 6 dozen arrows have been shot scored and verified the club representative will select the best three scores and submit them as the team score. The team with the highest collective score will be the winning team.	
Juniors (U18, U16, U14, U12).	All competitors under the age of 18 years old must be supervised by a parent, guardian or other responsible adult at all times. For the WA60 (U18), Cadets the age of entrants must be under 18 on 31/12/2019 (if you turn 18 in 2019 you will need to enter the WA70 round). For Metric: M50 (U16), M40 (U14), M30 (U12). Archery GB age rules will apply. The age of entrants is their age on the day of the tournament.	
Registration and Eligibility.	All athletes are required to register and to confirm their target allocation in case of any late alterations. Only athletes affiliated to Archery GB or to another World Archery member association are eligible to shoot; proof of membership will be requested at the tournament.	
Equipment Inspection.	It is a mandatory requirement for an athlete's equipment inspections to be carried out by the Judges prior to commencement of shooting at all UK Record Status events and World Archery status event. Carbon only arrows are not allowed at this event.	
Event timings.	Registration from 08:00 Equipment inspection from 08:15 Assembly 08:30 Practice 08:45 to 09.30 (45 minutes) Shooting 09:30 - 12:30	Registration from 13:00 Equipment inspection from 13:15 Assembly 13.30 Practice 13:45 to 14:30 (45 minutes) Shooting 14:30-17:30
	Exact afternoon timings are dependent on the completion time of the morning session but will not be before the stated times.	
Lunch period.	Will extend from the end of the morning session until start of the afternoon session (14.30).	

¹ Master or Veteran: Is an archer greater than 50 years old.

² A Cadet/U18 archer shoots at 60M on a 122mm face.

³ Novice (WA60 single sound): Any archer who has been shooting for less than two years

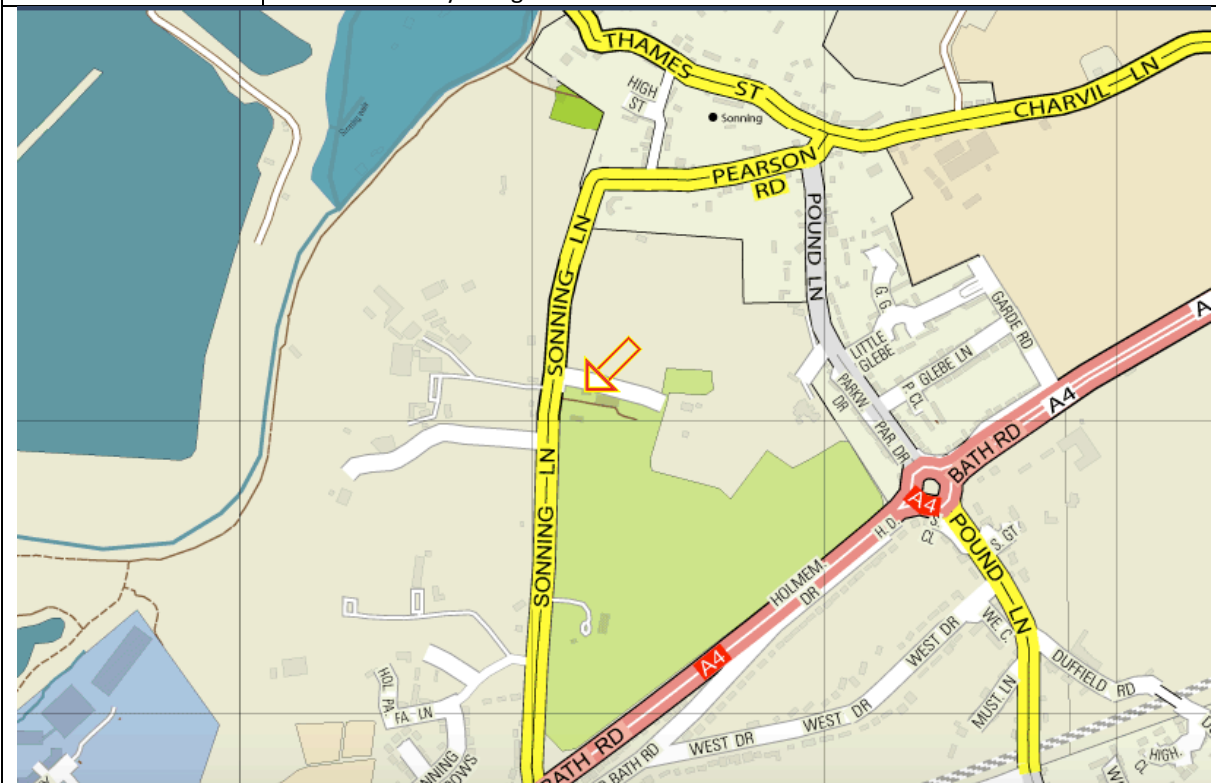
Format.	All bosses will be from https://www.tenzonetargets.com and layered foam bosses. 4 archers per boss for all rounds. Bosses spaced at 3.0M intervals (9.8ft). Shooting will be timed ends of 6 arrows in 4 minutes in 2 details. All round will be 6 dozen-arrows. 70m, 60m on 122mm face. 50m 6 zone 80 cm faces. Metric rounds will be 122mm faces.
Timing system.	The Berkshire Archery Association have agreed to loan their Chronotir2 Timing System for timing at the event.
Scoring.	A single score board system will be used and passed round at the target by the archers so that each archer records one other archers score who then has the chance to check the correct recording of their own score before recording the next archers score (The Redruth system).
Drug testing.	Athletes competing at record status tournaments may be liable for drug testing. Competitors who are approached to provide samples must comply. Failure to do so will be treated as a positive result. Parents/Guardians must sign the relevant box on the Entry form giving their consent for under 18s to be drug tested if approached.
Lost arrows.	The venue is a playing field for various sports hence all lost arrows MUST be accounted for. All lost arrows must be reported to a judge. It is the archer's responsibility to locate any missed arrows before leaving the field. Carbon only arrows are not allowed at this event.
Dress.	All competitors must comply with Archery GB dress regulations. Any archer not complying with these regulations will not be permitted to shoot. (Archery GB Rules of Shooting Rule 307 for details). https://www.archerygb.org/wp-content/uploads/2017/06/Proc-01-05-RoS-April-2018.pdf
Trophies and medals.	The County will award trophies for archers from Berkshire and medals Berkshire archers and for visiting archers (1 st , 2 nd and 3 rd).
Refreshments.	Hot drinks and light snacks will be available all day. The Berkshire County Sports Club (BCSC) will be selling a) Hot food and cold drinks prior the start of the event and b) Running a barbeque over the lunch break. The club bar will be open from 12pm to 6pm.
Photography.	Anyone wishing to take photographs must sign to advise the tournament organiser of this during registration. If the anyone wishes to photograph or video of children they must acknowledge that have read the Archery GB Guidance Document '(SCG 05) Photographing/Videoring Children and Young People in Sport 'and the 'Photography and Filming Consent Form'. Car parking.	Please park in the designated parking area. Do not park on the grass or obstruct any area.
Toilets.	Are situated in the Club House. Disabled toilets and baby changing facilities are available.
Camping.	Camping is not allowed at the venue.
Dogs and Pets.	No dogs (or other pets) are permitted on the premises or anywhere in the field areas. Guide dogs accepted.
Smoking.	Smokers please smoke in the area well behind the tent line and dispose of cigarettes ends responsibly and not on the grass. Smoking includes E-cigarettes. Please see Archery GB smoking policy. http://www.archerygb.org/wp-content/uploads/2017/05/OPP06g02CodeofConductSmoking-22008-1.pdf

<p>Withdrawal and Cancellation Policy.</p>	<p>Withdrawal or cancellation requests up to 14 days prior to the tournament date shall be accepted. Please allow 14 days for handling refund requests. In the case of a withdrawal or cancellation after the closing date the Organiser is not obliged to refund any entry fee(s), the exception being if the entrant can render written proof of their inability to shoot (medical certificate or letter, police detention, family bereavement). Such matters will be treated individually and in confidence. If the competitor fails to attend the competition without any prior notice they will forfeit all entry fees paid.</p>
